

Inventory of Equipment, Rigging, and Supplies on Alouette

I. Exterior:

- Screacher on roller furler (for use only by experienced skipper and crew)
- New dacron jib on roller furler
- 42' 6" rotating mast (no controls, rotates by itself)
- Well used, but good condition pinhead main sail with 2 reefing points
- All reefing procedures can be done from at the mast
- All halyard clutches on mast with safety cleats underneath
- EZ Jax system for main sail, can be retracted against mast for sail cover
- 2 flag halyards
- 2 Bowmar hatches for ventilation – 1 in V berth, 1 in head
- Dagger board lines run aft to cockpit
- 2 sheet winches, 1 halyard winch
- 4 mooring lines on starboard side
- Cushioned seats on aft beams
- 2 "captains" chairs mounted on cockpit combing (great places to steer from)
- Combination mainsheet / traveler system (Mike Leneman's design)
- 9.9 hp Yamaha outboard with 2:1 lifting tackle to raise and lock engine
- 4:1 lifting tackle for raising rudder
- Navigation lights (steaming light and anchor light are removable and normally stowed in side in compartment behind chart table)

II. Exterior compartments:

- In bow anchor locker:
 - 1 XYZ 13# anchor with 10' chain, 160' nylon rode marked every 20 ft
 - 40' of 7/16" nylon line and block with snap shackle attached for bridal
 - 1 pair cotton gloves
- In Port float:
 - 2nd anchor (15# Danforth) with 10' chain and 150' nylon rode
 - other extra lines
 - 2 sets oars for dinghy
 - 2 wooden paddles (emergency rudder)
 - foot pump for dinghy
 - yellow cushion (POB dummy)
 - tent (if needed)
- In Starboard float:
 - 3 large fenders, and 3 small fenders
 - extra mooring lines
 - "Jonny Docker" hook and line

- In cockpit lockers:
 - 2 – 3 gal fuel tanks both with gages and fuel hose fittings
 - 1 – 1 gal fuel tank, butane fuel cans for stoves
 - “Tiller Tamer” (bungee cord with plastic hooks)
 - small tiller extender handle (hiking stick)
 - plug in for tiller pilot (port side aft bulkhead)
 - documentation #s (floor of port compartment)

III. Interior main living spaces:

- V berth: small, but adequate sleeping space for 2 people
 - under V berth are the fresh water and holding tanks(15 gallons each)
 - 2 small decorator/sleeping pillows are stored in V berth just add pillow cases
- Head: basic; sink, shower (crude but effective, warm water, water manual pump), head, mirror behind door, small compartment with shelves
- Main cabin:
 - galley on aft port side; slides back under cockpit to give 6' sleeping bunk
 - galley sink with manual pump
 - 2 portable butane stoves in cases on shelf above galley
 - 2 boards stored under seat cushions for expanding food prep area
 - Nav. station aft on starboard side; also slides back for 6' sleeping bunk
 - VHF radio above nav. station
 - 10” Standard Horizon GPS Chartplotter
 - Electric switch panel (AC & DC) with digital voltmeter and 3 stage battery charger
 - Tank monitor guages for both fresh water and holding tanks
 - numerous storage compartments described below
 - 2 more decorator/sleeping pillows
 - boat hook and long hiking stick stored on hooks at floor level under bunks
 - slide out steps for easier access (especially for short people) to seats/bunks
 - 72 qt. Igloo cooler with drain line plumbed overboard
 - 2 light blankets and 4 pillow cases stored under cooler

IV. Interior storage compartments:

- compartments under aft end of V berth: valve and manual pump to pump holding tank overboard; also speed log and depth sounder transducer
- forward step compartment – available for guest use as desired
- under cockpit (aft of removable companionway steps) 2 cockpit cushions, 2 folding “go anywhere” chairs, 3 bunkboards, 1 extra bunk cushion, trash can on shelf on starboard side
- drawers and compartments under galley, nav. Station, bench seats, and behind bench seats in main cabin (see below for contents of these)

V. Main cabin Drawers and compartments:

- under galley – silverware drawer (setting for 6 + knives, serving spoons, etc.)

- under nav. Station – plates, bowls, paper plates & holders, cooking pans (10" & 7" fry pans; 7"X3" & 6"X3" sauce pans; 7"X7" [4.6 qt] pot)
- under chart table lid – charting supplies, tide table book, all ship's papers and equipment manuals (in black pouch), cruising guide, pens, pencils, dinghy pump adapters, chart book, key lock with key
- behind chart table – air horn, flashlight, steaming light, anchor light, tiller pilot, Canadian courtesy flag
- fwd drawer, starboard side: boat equipment drawer - reefing lines, 3 large snatch blocks (\$270 each!) jack lines, harness line, barberhauler/2nd reef line, temp shroud turnbuckles, 2 carabiners (for hooking to a mooring ball ring), 4:1 block & tackle with hooks
- fwd drawer port side – misc. extra lines and fasteners, beam bolt wrench, can of Sailcoat spray lube, spare winch handle
- aft drawers both sides – kitchen supplies
- center drawers both sides – available for food
- upper compartment starboard side aft – binoculars with compass, otherwise available for guest use
- upper compartment port side fwd – books, destination brochures
- other compartments – available for guest use
